

IIAS AGRIC LOAN PROGRAM PROJECT PURPOSE

The purpose of the IIAS Agric. Project is to increase the capacity of small scale farmers to produce food for themselves and the market. During the workshop on this topic, farming activities and the applicable technologies were discussed. The application of appropriate technology was explored. Some of the feedback received include activities like cassava processing, palm oil processing, mushroom and snail farming. The idea is that if many people are involved in primary and secondary activities, productivity will increase.

WHO QUALIFIES

The focus of the IIAS Project group is to identify people who are involved in farming activities but are not able to qualify for regular bank loans or financing. The aim is to help these people increase their productivity, market their products within well designed channels and expand participation. <u>BUSINESS MODELS</u>

Business models presented will continue to be subjected to scrutiny to determine who it works for and for whom it can be adapted. It is assumed that no single model will work for everyone or every community. The impact of country conditions and cultural beliefs will be evaluated by the IIAS Monitoring Team to determine what would work.

EXPECTATIONS

Expectations include that models that work or can be adapted will be agreed upon. Qualified people will be provided funding under clearly defined guidelines. We welcome ideas from professionals from different backgrounds and countries who would provide country conditions that may have been ignored during program design.

STATUS

To date, more than one hundred individuals have indicated willingness to participate. Most of these are from Nigeria, Zimbabwe, Ghana, Tanzania, Uganda and Togo. We encourage others to extend the information to people in other parts of Africa.

As explained before, there should be no expectation for free money. Emergency or fly-by farmers will not qualify.

<u>THE PROCESS</u>

1. Accept Applications;

2. Place Applications in three main groups based on geographical location, Specialty & Funding Needs;

- 3. Interview Applicants;
- 4. Verifications of the participant to confirm identity;
- 5. Certification about good faith efforts, guarantor(s) and willingness to abide by the rules;
- 6. Award Loans; and Monitor the process for improvement. <u>Executive Action</u>
- Choosing a bank;
- Relations with bank; and

The Bible Story Of Jacob In Genesis 30:27-28 And 30:32-43 Become A Point Of Reference For Dealing With The Issue Of Being Creative Amid The Treachery. Jacob Had Suffered In The Hands Of His Treacherous Uncle And Later Father-In-Law; He Worked For Him For Over 20 Years, When It Was Time For His Master To Set Him Free And Release Him, Be Brought In Further Treachery.

Jacob Grew The Flocks Because He Had Learnt The Trade From His Parent And Mastered The Art. He Became Creative Due To Observation And Innovated To Birth New Breeds Of The Flock. Get Knowledge And Understanding. It Will Give You An Informed Perspective To Understand Beyond The People's Actions. The Actions Could Be Situated Within Some Cultural Context And Upbringing. Jacob Knew When To Tell His Wives And Children To Leave, Hide Something, Or Where.

Like The Envelope Of Perseverance, The NASA Mars Rover Was Sent To Collect The First-Ever Mars Rock Sample. We Need To Find Better Solutions When Faced With Adversity And Pushed Forward To Achieve Our Goal. Despite Huge Potential For Disaster During The Seven Minutes Of Terror That Every Mars Rover Requires To Plummet Through Mars' Atmosphere And Safely Land, Everything Worked As Planned For Perseverance, And The Touchdown Was A Huge Success (Https://Www.Cnet.Com/News/A-Historic-Moment-Nasa-Perseverance-Rover-Collects-First-Ever-

We Can Advise People Facing Similar Challenges And Provide Roadmaps And Mentorship As Solution Providers.

In Overcoming These Challenges, Jacob Did Some Immoral Acts And His Life's Story That He Had To Confront In Later Years. In This Vein, As We Overcome Challenges That Life Throws At Us, We Can Confront Our Mortality And Not Lose Our Morality While Being Innovative And Creative.
