LEADERSHIP EXCELLENCE: EMPOWERING THE NEXT GENERATION OF AFRICAN LEADERS

A major reason for the socio-economic and political woes of Africa is the phenomenon of corruption and lack of patriotism. For instance, in Nigeria, the situation presents a paradox of sorts. The challenge of managing ethnic-religious diversity and prolonged militarized approach left a legacy of instability inter-gender animosities and a culture of impunity.

The pockets of violence suggest that the tension generated by socioeconomic disparities among religious and ethnic groups has escalated violence in many communities, in addition can make meaningful progress without experiencing patriarchy, misogyny and unfair political leadership. This is because national development has always been an outcome of good leadership. To attain an effective level of democratic governance with the values of transparency, accountability, equity, justice, responsiveness, participation, and rule of law, the need to substitute the youth as good leadership in a paradigm.

This requires helping them to develop the skills and confidence needed to succeed. This in turn will encourage an organized transition from one generation to another. Research has shown that young people have actively sought to bring social, political and economic change to their countries and Nigerian youth cannot be an exception. Youth participation in Nigeria has become such a powerful idea with such a different quest for the political leadership of the country to be handed over to young people. The question is: How prepared and equipped are the Nigerian youth for leadership? It is not enough to claim that power be handed over to the youth, conscious effort should be made to equip them for the task ahead. Development of leadership skills and confidence in the young men and women is essential. The importance of an in-depth leadership training program for the Nigerian youth cannot be over-emphasized.

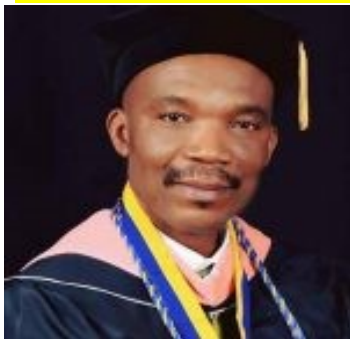
One Africa (Africa Unification and Harmonization)

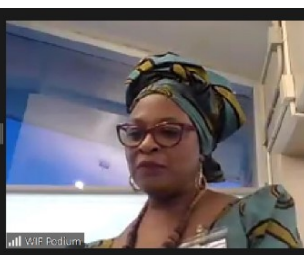
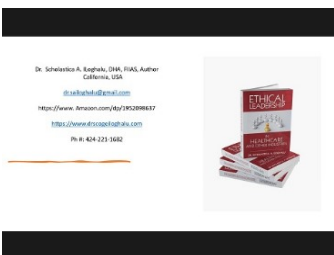
