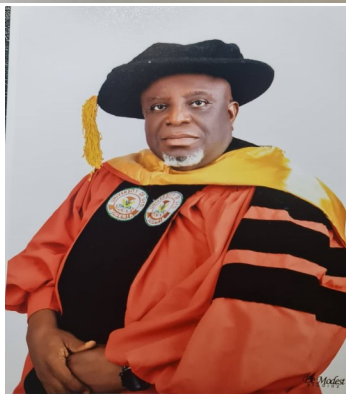


AFRICANIZATION ACCREDITATION COUNCIL
