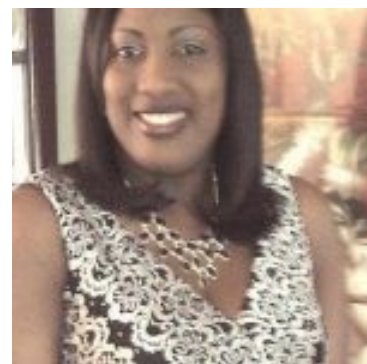


## WELCOME TO 2023!!!

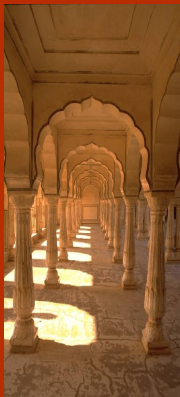

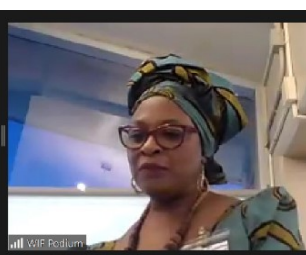
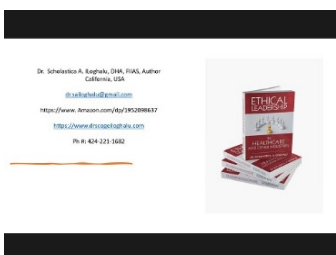

# AFRICAN PEOPLE'S COURT

African masses have held the short end of the stick for way too long. The individuals saddled with the responsibility of leading Africans have often taken decisions that are inimical to the best interest of citizens of their respective countries. Reports reaching the African People's Court indicated that law courts in the different countries of Africa are out of reach of the ordinary citizens. Citizens often crash under the heavy burden of legal confusion. Legal aid is also understood to be either unavailable or too complicated for the ordinary citizen to navigate.

Citizens of any African country who feel that their governments have been high-handed should feel free to submit reports to the African People's Court for adjudication. This court belongs to the African masses. It must be pointed out that Africans are generally one. The countries are creations of colonialists who put new boundaries where they did not previously exist. The peoples of Africa are nationalities. Some of those nationalities have found themselves lumped together with divergent nations within the continent. Thus, rights of the masses are easily trampled upon or eroded. The African People's Court is available.

### African Orientation Council

During the orientation period, the individual learns about the organization, who is who, what is where, how and why, etc. These pieces of knowledge shape the new employee's attitude to work and set the stage for the employee's success on the job. When a new breed of Africans become confident enough to reject the kinds of patronage that erodes national consciousness, IAS will know that the plants are bearing fruit. 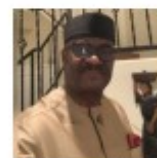
