Dr. Anastasia Ashi is the Chairman of IIAS African Health Organization. The 54+ countries on the African continent continue to indicate a shared need – healthcare programs that address the challenges of each country’s peoples. IIAS organized a group of experts in the different Healthcare special- ble for responding to each country’s healthcare policy needs when the countries come calling. IIAS African Health Organization does not provide a static or straight-jacket formula. IIAS recognizes that each country’s needs are unique and often subject to the country’s cultural antecedents. Therefore, Dr. Anastasia Ashi and members of her AHO team are able to tailor policy and strategy to the specific needs of the requesting countries or entities within it. Africa has 55 countries. The ASHO Model uses a representation format by which every African country is represented by a Scholar or Professional from the International Institute for African Scholars. The Country Representatives are Africans with extensive knowledge and experience. They occupy decision-making positions in organizations across multiple spectra and industry. They interface with appropriate local country healthcare officials associated with the African Health Organization for a seamless delivery of benefits to the masses across rural and urban Africa.

Africa’s 55 countries are organized in sub-regions. Each region has a Regional Coordinator.

### RECOMMENDATIONS

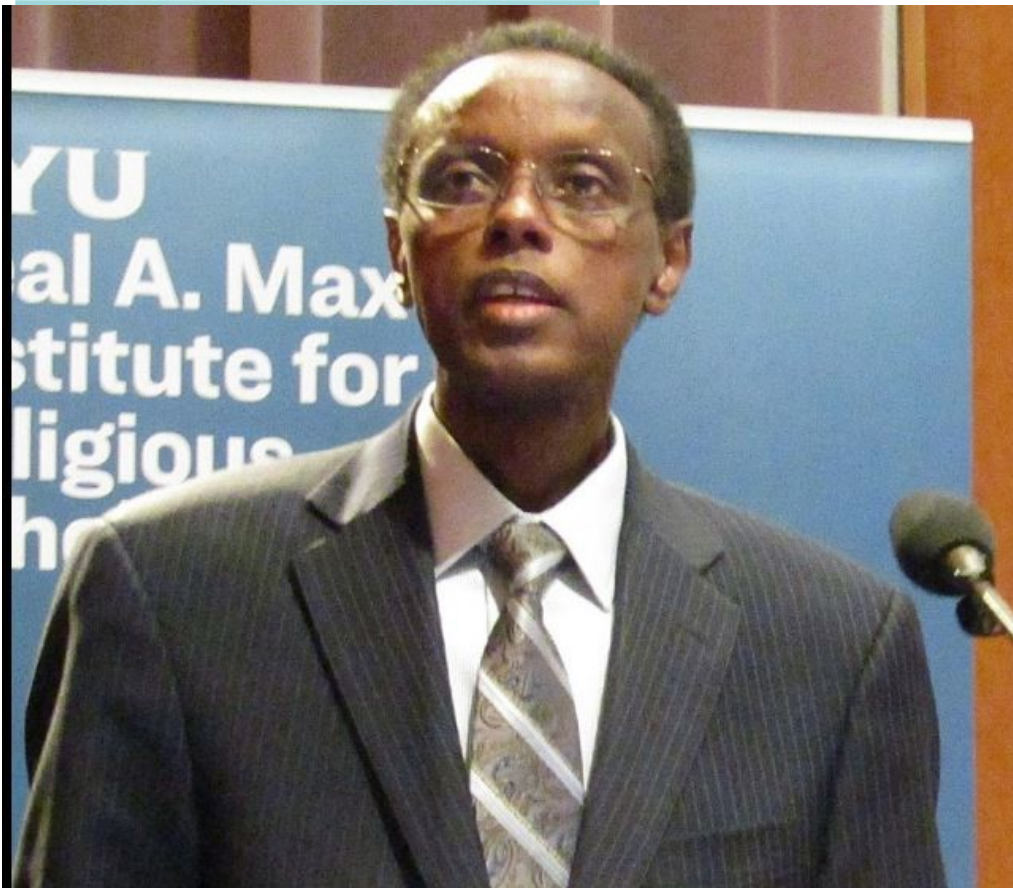
